

MARCH 7, 2016 THE ORCHARDIST, by Amanda Coplin Discussion Leader: Doris Snyder

The characters in Amanda Coplin's debut novel, THE ORCHARDIST, are deeply rooted in the history of the American west. At the turn of the twentieth century, in a rural stretch of the Pacific Northwest, a reclusive orchardist, William Talmadge, tends to apples and apricots as if they were loved ones. A gentle man, he's found solace in the sweetness of the fruit he grows and the quiet, beating heart of the land he cultivates. One day, two teenage girls appear and steal his fruit from the market; they later return to the outskirts of his orchard to see the man who gave them no chase. Feral and scared, the girls take up on Talmadge's land and indulge in his deep reservoir of compassion. Just as the girls begin to trust him, men arrive in the orchard with guns, and the shattering tragedy that follows will set Talmadge on an irrevocable course not only to save and protect but also to reconcile the ghosts of his own troubled past.

Coplin's writing is beautifully poetic, compelling and haunting. Her understanding of abuse and the lasting effects of fear and loss on the individual psyche are deeply resonant. THE ORCHARDIST has been compared to Emily Bronte's WUTHERING HEIGHTS, Charles Frazier's COLD MOUNTAIN, Pat Barker's ANOTHER WORLD, and Marilynne Robinson's GILEAD, with echoes of John Steinbeck. It's a page-turner.

COFFEE HOUR PRESENTATION BY THE GOING LOCAL GUIDING TEAM

On January 17th, Members of the Guiding Team, Doris Snyder and Mesrob Odian, and Vestry Member Jenn Trevisan updated the congregation on the Going Local Congregational Meeting that took place in November, 2015. They shared a visual representation they were asked to create on what St. David's was thankful for and where God is calling us to be missional. It is currently hanging on the Going Local bulletin board. Doris asked for input from the coffee hour attendees which was added to the visual display.

Doris shared another assignment that was given at the Congregational Gathering. The Guiding Team and Vestry in attendance were asked if you went away for 5 years and came back to your church what would you want to see. Doris shared the following answers from the GT and Vestry:

More young people

Mixture of tradition & modern service

A place where something is happening every day

Success with going local

Community garden/center

Worship that evolves & changes with the community

A place where we are physically and spiritually maintained

A community center where love is present, seen and obvious

Doris asked for input from everyone. A lively conversation ensued and the following points were made:

Exciting & chaotic Un/predictable Stability Taking risks Meta-stable

Doris then explained that the next phase of Going Local is the experiment phase where we test different ideas out within the community. She shared that GT originally agreed to a community garden as an experiment but they did not feel this was spirit led. As a result of a simple conversation another idea for the first experiment has taken hold. The GT is refining the experiment right now and will be meeting with the Diocese's Going Local Representatives soon. Stay tuned!

Vestry Meeting Highlights - January 21, 2016

Following the opening prayer led by David we reviewed the norms governing vestry functioning.

Working in small groups, we determined our primary goals for Membership, Discipleship, and Stewardship for the upcoming year.

We discussed issues brought up by the congregation, including the cold church and restrooms, welcoming and assisting those who might be visiting, especially at Christmas and Easter, making the church more handicapped-friendly, and a possible knitting ministry.

Dale Pappas-Wilhelm, representing the Guiding Team, reported on their progress on coming up with an 'experiment'.

We voted to remove the so-called grocery card 'loan repayment' line item from the books.

We agreed that this year's annual meeting went very well, many saying it was the best they ever remembered.

We discussed various options for a Lenten program, including a possible speaker.

We approved the Treasurer's report for December as presented, and offered a suggestion for making the Treasurer's notes more meaningful.

We approved the formation of an 'ad hoc committee' to explore ways to expand and make our outreach more relational.

We amended and approved the church calendar for February.

We agreed to write a letter of support to Bishop Beckwith and Michael Curry, the Presiding Bishop, commending them for their 'grace under fire' following the recent decision of the Prelates.
