Vestry Meeting Highlights November 15, 2017

Mary-Esther Arther led the opening prayer.

We discussed concerns from the congregation: reluctance to pledge until we call a new priest; concern that there won't be enough support for an 8:00 o'clock service (there will be); better use of our outside sign; the need to wear name tags during this time of transition; the need for visible access to any room with children; including upcoming activities in the Sunday bulletin.

Stewardship reported that there are still 5 outstanding pledges for 2018, and that we are still down \$16,000 from the 2017 pledges even if those 5 come through with the same amount as 2017. There will be a budget forum on December 10th.

The Outreach Committee reported outreach plans through the end of the year, when there will be a number of changes made pending Vestry approval.

We gave thanks for Guy Baskinger; for all those involved in the Beefsteak Dinner & Silent Auction; for the property clean-up crew; and for Nancy Moody's return to the alto section.

Mutual Ministry Review takes place on Saturday, November 18th, with Fr. Keith Gentry as facilitator

We reviewed and approved the October Treasurer's Reports.

The Property Committee reported on the fall clean up day. It was noted that the yellow jackets have disappeared with the cold; that the annual leaf clean-up will be in a few weeks; that we have contracted for snow removal; and that the Eagle Scout project is pending.

We voted to approve the Christmas Outreach Letter, the proposed signboard policy, the collecting of gifts for the children of inmates, and the collecting Wal-Mart gift cards to give to our client neighbors so they can buy Christmas gifts.

We voted to approve dispensing with the Advent IV service on Christmas Eve, and moving the greening of the church to Saturday, December 23rd.

In an Executive Session held Saturday, November 18th we voted to approve a new outreach policy that covers present and future practices.

We amended and approved the December calendar.
