From our Priest, The Rev. Jon M. Richardson

Dear Friends,

Advent is the time when we prepare for Christmas, but even more, it's the time when we prepare for Christ. One of the things you're likely to hear most often in our worship at St. David's is that we are called, as Christians, to keep looking for Christ in the world around us. During Advent, we live into that calling in a different way, joining with our ancestors of



the faith from those millennia ago: the people of Israel who would become the first Christians – even before there was a name for this band of followers of Jesus who came to believe that he was, indeed, the Messiah, sent from God.


We hear it and say it again and again, year after year, but it's important to remember that the Christ did not come as expected. The ancestors of our faith believed that the Messiah who had been promised and long-expected would come as a mighty king – one who would overthrow their oppressors and make them free.

In hindsight, knowing the story as we do, it's easy to miss how radical the truth that they discovered turned out to be. The Messiah was not a mighty warrior, but a vulnerable child. The Messiah was not a product of the best families and "good breeding", but a child born out of wedlock – an embarrassment even.

So let us not discount the miracle that would come – not just in the birth, but the miracle that happened in the people recognizing God's own anointed leader, "God *with* us", even though the form was unlike any that might have been imagined. The miracle wasn't just in the person of Jesus, but in all the people of God who recognized him.

When we look for Christ, it is entirely possible – even likely – that "packages" won't look as we'd probably expect. In fact, if the character of God remains consistent, Christ is almost certain to not look like we'd expect. So don't just look for Christ in church. Look under the rocks, and around the corners, and in the dark alleys, and at the homeless shelters, and even in the faces of the grumpy people waiting in lines at stores and frustrated in traffic. It has been promised: when we seek, we will find.

- Sunday, December 23—The annual Greening of the Church, following the 10:00 service. Many hands make light work and will be much appreciated


OFFICE CLOSURES DURING DECEMBER

Vestry Meeting Highlights November 26, 2018

John Simonelli led the opening prayer and spoke about his call to prison ministry.

We discussed matters brought to us by parishioners – about posting Jon's sermons online, which he is now doing, and about keeping joys and concerns strictly about personal matters.

Stewardship reported that the net profit from the Beefsteak Dinner and Auction was \$6766.16 and the net profit from A Christmas Carol was \$316.00. They proposed possibly arranging a performance of A Christmas Carol next year at a date closer to Christmas, which the Vestry supports.

Outreach reported that so far this year we've donated \$5,200 to 5 local food pantries, and beginning this month to North Porch, that Gill has delivered coats to the Lakeland YMCA, that 4 have signed up to be knitters, that ERD has been added to our Christmas outreach giving, that we are planning to hold a special blessing when the Kinnelon Animal Shelter reopens next Spring, and that we would like to include 'food loading helpers' on the list of ways to help for outreach meals to the St. Paul's Men's Shelter.

We gave thanks for Mike Roehrer and his crew for the Fall clean-up, for Michael Kidney for taking on maintenance of the church sign and for his commitment to the knitting ministry, for the Budget & Finance Committee for preparing the 2019 budget, for all those who provided food and help for the Community Thanksgiving Service and A Christmas Carol, for Lee Moody for delivering the prison outreach gifts, and for the Rev Dr. Elizabeth Kaeton for facilitating the Vestry Mutual Ministry Review.

We reviewed the October Quickbooks reports and voted to accept them.

We reviewed the 2019 Budget prepared by the Budget & Finance Committee and voted to accept it.

The Property Committee reported that the Fall clean-up day addressed many areas both outside and inside the church, that the dampness issue in the sacristy has been addressed and is much improved, and that issues with the handicapped bathroom door, the outdoor electrical problem, and the driveway visibility are being addressed.

The Property Committee also recommended that we go forward with the work of replacing the sanctuary lights with LED bulbs and replacing the dimmer switches which control the lights, which the Vestry approved.

We amended and approved the December calendar.

Vestry Mutual Ministry Review—November 17

On Saturday, November 17th, the priest, wardens and vestry gathered with the Rev. Dr. Elizabeth Kaeton as facilitator for the Mutual Ministry Review, which is a way we ask ourselves how we are doing. It was a time to celebrate what we have done well and to understand what might be done better. We began with a brief meditation and then engaged in a spiritual exercise which asked us to consider what gospel story or parable or character animated our sense of ministry as individuals. We reviewed what a MMR is and is not, and looked back on our accomplishments for 2018 and what we hoped to accomplish in 2019, such as considering a lay preaching course, having a monthly breakfast for between both services, and increasing parishioner participation and involvement. We then established three major goals for 2019:

* Increase stability of leadership

* Increase stability in our communities

* Increase participation of the congregation in the life of the Church.

All present agreed that it was a very meaningful experience and came away with a renewed sense of optimism. - John Simonelli, Senior Warden
