From our Priest, The Rev. Jon M. Richardson Dear Friends,

In the month of June, often people's minds turn to travel and vacations. Households with children (or teachers!) in them are beginning to eagerly count the days until the summer reprieve.

Rest is an important part of the Christian vocation. Even those of us who don't have summers off still need time to



rest. In one biblical account of creation, after all was created, God rested. It was a time to sit back, and to admire the work, and to recharge for the work that would follow. It's from this account that the tradition of Sabbath emerges – a day each week that is set aside to follow the example of God: to rest and recharge.

You'll remember in Lent, when we started worship each Sunday with the Penitential Order, we recited the Ten Commandments every week. And the fourth one we read each week was to "remember that thou keep holy the Sabbath day." And we asked God to "incline our hearts to keep this law."

Sabbath is no joke. It's not something to be taken lightly. It is a part of our obligation as people of faith, and particularly, as people of this Judeo-Christian tradition. And it's not just about rest – not setting an alarm and taking a day off work. It's also about recharging. That's part of why we go to church. There's supposed to be time on the Sabbath for rest, but also time for recharging – for appreciating the work that has already happened, but also for preparing for all that's next.

As your mind turns to "time off" – whether it's during the summer or any other time of year, or even if it's just a day or two here and there – I encourage you to try to use that time intentionally as Sabbath. Take time to rest. Take time to appreciate all the work that you've done, and all that's led you to where you are. But also take time to re-charge. You can do that through specific acts of worship that recharge your spirit, but don't forget to also recharge your mind and your body and even your emotional health. Read something. Discover a place that can feed your soul. Get up and get out and explore. Because it's not enough to shut down for a while. You also have to power up. It's a part of your Christian vocation.

Vestry Meeting Highlights May 15, 2019

Kathy Kent led the opening prayer and Pat Hodde spoke about how the Parent family's decision for organ donation extended their family into the lives of the recipients' families.

Concerns from the congregation were dampness in the sacristy, absence of the Palm Sunday church procession, Joys and Concerns need to be louder, mold in the basement, flags need to be replaced, and ponding in the church lot and grounds.

Stewardship reported that we netted \$600 from the Fish & Chips Supper and that the dates for the Parish Potluck Barbeque (8/9), Thrill of the Grill (9/7), Stewardship Brunch (9/22), Beefsteak Dinner (10/26), and A Christmas Carol (12/7) have been confirmed. They proposed a wine and cheese pairing on Saturday, July 13 from 4:00 to 6:00 PM hosted by Steve Kent, which the Vestry approved. Mike Roehrer reported that we netted \$1,438.50 from the plant sale and that all donated plants were planted.

We gave thanks for Michael Kidney for potting the palms and seeing to their upkeep, for reconnecting the long disconnected speaker, and for helping to renovate the rector's new office; for the Altar Guild for their Easter altar display; for Gill for her Holy Week work; for Sondra Odian for being guest Vestry clerk; for all the Holy Week helpers and readers; for the Choir for their beautiful singing during Holy Week; for those who participated in Spring cleanup day; for Mike and Debbie Roehrer for heading up the plant sale; for Debbie Roehrer and Catherine Speed for doing the planting the day of the sale, and for Scott Ashton for taking crucifer training.

We reviewed and accepted the April Quickbooks reports.

We reviewed Jon Richardson's letter of agreement as amended by the Diocese.

We voted to retroactively approve 4 emergency plumbing repairs, and that the money to pay for them would come from the Whitehead bequest.

We voted to approve this year's David Hegg Award nominees.

Property Committee reported on what was accomplished on Spring cleanup day, on the emergency septic and plumbing issues, on the replacement of the rectory refrigerator which is malfunctioning, and noted that things put on hold because of the Spring cleanup and plant sale will now be focused on.

We amended and approved the June Calendar.


