

From our Priest, The Rev. Jon M. Richardson

Dear Friends,

Each week, during the celebration of the Holy Eucharist, one of the things we do is an exchange of the Peace. The Peace – as an element of the liturgy – is one that often evokes strong reactions from people, both positive and sometimes negative. When the Peace, as we know it, was introduced in the 1979 Book of Common Prayer, some people were put off by it. They thought it was too informal, too familiar, and an invasion of personal space. Others, however, welcomed it – as a time to



express joy and freedom in the midst of worship. This "innovation" (though not really new) has come to be practiced in a wide variety of ways. In some churches, the Peace is subdued – with parishioners simply turning to offer a quiet word to the people immediately around them. In others, like St. David's, it can be a more raucous moment in the liturgy, with people leaving their pews and enthusiastically greeting as many people as the time will allow. Both methods have their merit. In the more subdued churches, worshippers are often proud that their expression of the Peace is respectful and reverent. In places like St. David's, we are proud that the Peace is an expression of our hospitality and warmth.

What few people remember, however, is that the Peace, however we execute it, is primarily a liturgical act of worship. It's not "half-time" or "pre-Coffee Hour". It is rooted in a Christian approach to conflict resolution as outlined by Jesus in Matthew 5:23-24. This text says, "when you are offering your gift at the altar, if you remember that your brother or sister has something against you, leave your gift there before the altar and go; first *be reconciled* to your brother or sister, and *then come* and offer your gift."

Exchanging the Peace each week is not because we need a moment to get up and stretch after the sermon. It's not because we need a break from the worship. It is a part of our worship. We are called to respond to the word of God that has been read, and sung, and preached about by *first* engaging in the holy work of reconciliation. Only then are we truly prepared to continue our worship at the altar. The altar is a place of love – the greatest love as represented in Christ's offering for the world. It's not a place of anger. We are commanded to leave that at the door.

I hope the Peace will continue to be a warm and joy-filled moment of our worship at St. David's. But remember what's really behind it. What would it mean to be an agent of reconciliation – not just because it's the right thing to do, but as a part of our worship of God?

Caroline Mossip & Ed Horton—St. David's Church, Kinnelon

St. David's Church in Kinnelon is delighted to honor two of our leaders who contribute in vital ways in the congregation: Caroline Mossip and Ed Horton.

Caroline has served St. David's as both a Vestry member and a Warden. Additionally, she coordinates the rotation of worship leaders of the 8:00 service year round. Caroline is trained as a Healing Minister, providing prayers during worship on the first Sunday of each month. She represents St. David's on the Board of Willing Hands, our resident day program for adults with developmental disabilities. She was a member of our recent Parish Profile Committee, worked on the planning committee of our annual Beefsteak Dinner and Silent Auction, and faithfully serves on the crew of parish photographers to document events and milestones of our parish. As one parishioner noted, "Whenever someone is needed, she quietly and efficiently steps up and does the task. It's a joy to serve with her!"

Most of Ed's work is around lending his expertise to keep St. David's financial systems running smoothly and transparently. He is a member of the Budget and Finance Committee, chairs the Audit Committee, and works tirelessly year-round to ensure that the parish meets and exceeds its obligation to be good stewards of the financial resources entrusted to us—a job most people would shun, but which Ed embraces with a kind and generous smile. He has been particularly instrumental in guiding the parish transition to modern accounting methods from our previous manual accounting.

Both of them regularly lead in worship as a reader, intercessor, and chalice bearer at both our 8:00 and 10:00 Sunday services. We are delighted to honor these two faithful leaders!

Vestry Meeting Highlights June 19, 2019

Nancy Moody led the opening prayer and Bonnie Hook took us behind the scenes of her work restoring the Good Shepherd Tiffany window for St. John's Church, Boonton.

Outreach reported that another delivery of supplies will be made to North Porch shortly; that \$1,200 in outreach checks were disbursed to local food banks in May; that \$1,112 was received in response to the Easter Outreach letter, which was equally divided between Willing Hands, the Interfaith Hospitality Ministry, and Episcopal Relief and Development; that the Project Linus yielded 4 containers of blankets; and that Jon will be contacting outreach speakers for the coming fall.

We gave thanks for the Time & Talent responders; for the Project Linus donors; for Bonnie & Rich Hook for their help in setting up the Rector's office; for Sal and the choir for their wonderful music programs throughout the year; and for Caroline Mossip and Ed Horton for their contributions to the parish.

We reviewed and accepted the May Quickbooks reports.

We approved the purchase of the Method: Donor CRM software, which will enhance our Quickbooks software, allowing the church and individual pledgers to easily track pledges.

Jon distributed and discussed a detailed program for enhanced church security, which outlined things which have already been done, things which need to be addressed now, and things which will be implemented over time.

We confirmed Thursday evening, September 12th for the Celebration of our New Ministry, with Jon as our Rector.

The Property Committee reported that all of our septic issues have been resolved, that the dampness issues in the sacristy and basement will be addressed, and that the driveway visibility will be improved.

We amended and approved the July and August calendars.


