From our Rector, The Rev. Jon M. Richardson

Dear Friends,

There's a certain grace that comes from having our Financial Stewardship campaign overlap as it does each year with our celebration of the Season of Creation in October. At St. David's we're good at thinking about our responsibilities as Christian stewards during more than just the financial campaign. In the Spring each year we focus on stewardship of our Time



& Talent, and in fact, the Stewardship Commission is active year-round preparing social events and fundraisers. So we know that caring for the resources with which we have been entrusted isn't just a once-each-year thing. It's an ongoing responsibility that we take seriously.

But it occurred to me this year, as I was reading through some newer liturgical resources from The Episcopal Church about Creation Season, that so much of this season is about stewardship. We begin with the Blessing of the Animals on the first Sunday in October. In that service we pray for God to bless the animals themselves, but also for God to bless us as we engage in the responsibility of caring for these creatures who are such blessings from God to us.

Our focus starts in the home, but quickly spreads out beyond ourselves. Creation Season spurs us to think of the blessings of creation that we enjoy every day. Here around St. David's, we are blessed by the beauty of creation in more concrete and tangible ways than many others might be – we are surrounded by so much natural beauty. And with those blessings, as is so often the case with blessings, responsibility goes hand in hand. We have been given glorious gifts in creation, and we are charged to care for it as best we can.

That's the same reality we discover in our financial stewardship campaign. Our first focus is to look within our own homes and lives – how are we being called to give of ourselves and our resources generously? But that focus quickly spreads beyond just ourselves. We have so many blessings here at St. David's, and our gifts to the church and to the world spread farther than most of us probably know. And with so many blessings passed to us by all those who have laid the foundation of this community, it's important to remember that with blessings comes responsibility. We are charged to care for this place, these people, and this ministry.

As you consider the gifts of creation and our responsibility to care for it this month, try to recognize the same calling we share to give thanks for and to care for this church and our wider ministry. May God bless your discernment richly.



the next step is studying the materials and making a decision.



Vestry Meeting Highlights September 18, 2019

John Simonelli led the opening prayer and Nancy Moody spoke of how the commitment of a Jehovah Witness client at the bereavement center where she works humbles and inspires her.

We discussed concerns from the congregation – the lack of a need for so much worship space; the poor congregational attendance at the celebration of new ministry; the quality of the "Celebration" invitations sent to the parish; and the general lack of support for each other at such events as the senior ministry recognition service. We also noted positive feedback about the Vestry Thanksgivings being included in the service leaflet and the new curtain screens in the parish hall.

The Stewardship Commission reported that we netted \$1,482.74 from the Thrill of the Grill, including a \$92.00 donation from Fairway Markets. They also noted that all tenant leases are current.

The Outreach Committee reported that the Celebration of New Ministry offering for Outreach was \$896.00 which was added to our outreach fund. They are intending to invite more guest "outreach" preachers in the future.

We gave thanks for the Bishop Hughes for officiating at the Celebration of New Ministry, for the Rev. Dr. Elizabeth Kaeton for preaching, and for the Rev. Deacon Deborah Drake for serving as deacon; for Kathy and Steve Kent and the kitchen, serving and clean-up crew; for John Simonelli for his "Costco Catering"; for Bonnie Hook and Julie Dolci for hosting; for all the service participants; for all the parish photographers; for the altar guild, particularly new member, Vicki Lutz; for the Rev. Sharon Hausman for being our first outreach guest preacher; for Jon Richardson and Michael Kidney for donating the new chalice and paten; for Michael Kidney for his diligence with sign maintenance; and for Nancy Moody for getting publicity for church events out in a timely manner.

We reviewed and accepted the August Quickbooks reports.

We amended and approved the October calendar.
