

From our Rector, The Rev. Jon M. Richardson

Dear Friends,

A couple of weeks ago, Bishop Hughes released a video message to the diocese in which she invited the people of the Diocese of Newark to join with her in dreaming about the future of the diocese. These messages that she releases every couple of weeks are always insightful and an interesting look into her



own emerging vision of the ministry we share. If you haven't had a chance to watch them, check out St. David's Facebook page (where we regularly post them) or the You-Tube channel for the Diocese of Newark.

As I've been readying my own mind and spirit (and worship booklets, and sermons...) for our observance of Advent this year, Bishop Hughes' message keeps sticking with me. How do we dream about the future of St. David's? How do we make ourselves ready for the realization of that dream?

Advent is about joyful and hopeful expectation. Like the time of expectation leading up to the birth of any child, it's a season filled with joy, hope, and yes, even dreams. It is so much truer, even, for the season of expectation leading up the coming of Christ.

We have dreams for what life will be like – for the one who is expected, but also for ourselves after the time has come. Of course we know that the hope and joy we imagine will be tempered by challenges and setbacks. That's the nature of life in the world. But even so, we remain hopeful.

Vestry Meeting Highlights November 20, 2019

Mary-Esther Arther led the opening prayer and John Simonelli read a story called "The Radical Orthodox Rabbi from Elizabeth Kaeton's blog site.

We discussed concerns from the congregation – the need for Vestry follow-up with those on their calling list if they don't see them in church for a while.

The Stewardship Commission reported that the net profit from the Beefsteak Dinner & Silent Auction was \$5,148.04 and that ticket sales for A Christmas Carol are moving along.

The Outreach Committee reported that all the various holiday outreach boxes are in the narthex and donations have already been received.

We reviewed the Christmas Outreach Letter

We gave thanks for Mary Harbinsky and her team members for their work on the silent auction; for Marty Stanton for serving as MC at the auction; for Roy Davidson for being a new choir member; for Michael Kidney for being a new chalice bearer; for Mike Roehrer and his clean-up crew; for Gill Otto for assuming new responsibilities; for Jane Jubilee for arranging the breakfast with the Bishop; and for the Budget & Finance Committee for their hard work preparing the 2020 budget.

We reviewed and accepted the October Quickbooks reports.

We finalized plans for the Vestry mutual ministry review which is being facilitated by the Rev. Canon Margo Clark on Saturday, November 23rd

We reviewed and voted to accept the 2020 parish budget.

The Property Committee reported that the clean-up of the basement storage room, memorial garden, walkway area, side lawn, and back yard was completed during Fall Clean-up Day, and that Adopt a Project 2 is planned for 2020.

We amended and approved the December calendar.

Vestry Mutual Ministry Review



On Saturday, November 23rd the rector, wardens and vestry gathered with the Rev. Canon Margo Clark as facilitator for our Mutual Ministry Review, which is the way we ask ourselves how we are doing. It was a time to celebrate what we have done well over the past year and to understand what might be done better. We began with a series of exercises, one of which – using photographs of parish life as icons for meditation – was particularly meaningful. We discussed what a mutual ministry review is and what it is not, and looked back on our accomplishments for 2019. We then established some "guideposts" for 2020:

Outreach – focus & refine. Keep finding our heart and refining our priorities.

Hospitality – work at listening better as a system – to hear needs AND recognize gifts

Discipleship – offer lay preaching instructions, continue bible study, offer confirmation class

Worship – fix or refigure worship teams; Joyful Noise – do it or not? Is something else needed or growing musically or otherwise?

Stewardship – Invite Cynthia McChesney, diocesan advisor for stewardship, to speak with the Stewardship Commission and Vestry – Do "Gifts Inventory" with the Vestry, and perhaps with the congregation as well.

All agreed that it was a very meaningful experience and came away with a renewed sense of optimism for the upcoming year.


